A verse for MAY

Mark Ch 16: verse 19

"So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God."

The date of Easter varies but is consistently during March or April. With the exception of 2011, this century Ascension Day has been in May and will be up to 2030 at least, which is as far as the list I looked at goes. But whenever it falls the message is the same, it is a reminder that Jesus did live with us on earth in human form but at this point returned to Heaven.

Also often in May, but not as consistently, we celebrate Pentecost when the ascended Jesus sent down the Holy Spirit to be with us here on earth.

Our celebrations of these events may not compete with Easter and Christmas, but they are just as important in God's plan for us and in many ways more important for us, who only have the reports of the life of Jesus which occurred so long ago.

It is Ascension and Pentecost which complete the package so to speak. God created the world; it started to go off track so God sent Jesus to show us the way. Having left the rules with us he returned to the Father but sent the Holy Spirit to be with us always to help us through. All we have to do is accept that help. Sadly it seems that over time more people in our world are not doing that.

May thoughts from the Vicar

Mention John and Charles Wesley and most people will think of Methodism. Yet both men were Anglicans, Charles in particular being very keen that the early Methodist fellowships should remain loyal to Anglicanism. The separation of Methodism from Anglicanism says more about the Church of England's unwillingness to be generous to an expression of faith embraced by working people.



It was during the evening of Wednesday 24th May 1738 that John Wesley went, as he says, 'unwillingly' to a meeting in Aldersgate Street for a conversation about the Epistle to the Romans.

It had already been a long day and maybe John was tired, but in that meeting he describes how at around a quarter to nine "I felt my heart strangely warmed." That was to be a life changing moment from which an extraordinary life and ministry were to follow.

The faith of the Wesleys has given us some of the greatest hymns which speak today as clearly as they did then. Whenever we sing 'Love divine, all loves excelling' I am captivated by the genius of Wesley's final verse.

"Changed from glory into glory till in heav'n we take our place, till we cast our crowns before thee, lost in wonder, love, and praise."

Members of the Salvation Army have a saying that when one of their members dies they have 'been promoted into glory'. That is rather good. But Wesley goes further. He knows the glory that is to come, beyond our expectation, beyond our comprehension, beyond our wildest imaginings. Yet, he says, this glory is rooted in the things of this world. The best things of this world are a foretaste of that which is to come. But they are still glorious and we must recognise this glory where we find it. Friendship, love, loyalty, persistence, tenacity, gentleness, perseverance. These best hallmarks of human relationships are glory, and they give us a foretaste of that which awaits us.

My first parish as a vicar was a joint Methodist /Anglican church in Warrington. It was in the New Town area so in reality we attracted people from a wide range of backgrounds. I was fortunate to be Recognised and Regarded on the Methodist Circuit and shared in Circuit meetings as well as Anglican Deanery gatherings. My Methodist colleagues were good friends.

One of the highlights of my week, shared I know with others, is on a Tuesday afternoon when a small group meet to study passages from the bible at Commonside Methodist Church. We are not terribly good at staying on topic and sometimes our conversation ends in places we have no idea how we got there. But just being together with friends is reason enough to make this time a priority.

There is parking in the field adjacent where you will be greeted by group of Alpacas. They assure me they are good Methodists but I have my doubts. Everyone is welcome, we start at 2.00pm and always finish by 3.00pm prompt.

MAY NEWS FROM ST MARY'S

□ Rogation Sunday

On Sunday 5th May, we mark Rogation Sunday. The word rogation comes from the Latin, "rogare", to ask, and traditionally, church congregations pray for the land and all who work



to grow crops for a plentiful harvest. In some parishes, the ancient tradition of "beating the bounds" is still carried out, with a procession of clergy, parishioners, banners, tractors and tools of the farmer's trade walking all around the parish boundary. Our boundaries stretch too far – about 18 miles, but our service of prayer and praise will be outdoors that morning, on Church Green, weather permitting. Bring a folding chair if you have one.

☐ Christian Aid Week 12th – 18th May

This big campaign week for Christian Aid will soon



be upon us and we'll be advertising it both inside and outside St Mary's. The charity's website, christianaid.org.uk gives us plenty of evidence of just how our support can make a huge difference, especially to those living from the land in countries where climate change is making life hard.

We have investigated moving the dancing onto the field but we are unable to do this due to the potential hazard caused by the fixings which would have to be in the middle of the playing area. So to make it as safe as possible we have changed the format slightly. Gates will open at 12 noon, with the procession and traditional



Maypole Dancing starting at 12.30 pm on Church Green.

Once the dancing is complete (approximately 1.30pm), we will move down to the School field for the Fair, with stalls including tombolas, lucky pouches, deal or no deal, games stalls, books and toys, sand bottle crafts and refreshments and of course soak the teacher. We are looking forward to bringing this back to being a real community event.




Whitegate Amblers
