He leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul; He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake.

"Out of obedience and devotion arises an habitual faith, which makes Him, though unseen, a part of all our life. He will guide us in a sure path, though it be a rough one: though shadows hang upon it, yet He will be with us. He will bring us home at last. Through much trial it may be, and weariness, in much fear and fainting of heart, in much sadness and loneliness, in griefs that the world never knows, and under burdens that the nearest never suspect. Yet He will suffice for all. By His eye or by His voice He will guide us, if we be docile and gentle; by His staff and by His rod, if we wander or are wilful: anyhow, and by all means, He will bring us to His rest."

For me Psalm 23 is one of the most comforting parts of our scripture and I think Cardinal Manning has captured the essence, not only of Psalm 23, but of where God and His son Jesus fit into our lives.

A message from the Vicar...

February - the Tupperware month

I really do not like February. As someone once said, living in Britain in February is like living inside a Tupperware box (other brands of food storage products are available). The skies are usually dull, the weather is cold and damp. It is the end of a long cold winter but spring seems never to come.

I am particularly miffed this year because whilst we had a brave snowdrop out at the east of St Mary's in December, and even some foolhardy daffodils flowering outside the school in the third week of Advent, all of the daffodils and snowdrops at the Vicarage seem to have drowned in the wet autumn weather. Where we would usually be seeing shoots emerging from the grass there is nothing at all.



The one redeeming factor for February is that it brings us to the Feast of Candlemas, one of my favourite festivals in the Church's year. The story is well known. Mary and Joseph go to the temple taking their newborn son to fulfil the traditions of the time. Their gift was modest, but represented Joseph's profession as a skilled craftsman, whose products were valuable in an agricultural economy. Whilst there they encounter two old people, Anna and Simeon, whose words foretell the destiny of this child, and his mother. It is a bittersweet festival. Our last look at the Crib, our first glimpse of the Cross. In our Candlemas services we dismantle our Cribs and put them away for another year. The year turns full circle once more and we mark the passage of life.

I am always mindful when we put the Crib away that some of us won't be here when it is brought out again next Advent. Part of our journey of life is to acknowledge our mortality, and to cherish the love of those with whom we have shared our days on this earth.

Simeon and Anna are fascinating people. We know very little about them, simply that they spent time in the Temple watching and waiting, trusting in God's promise of one who is to come. They got to see the Messiah, recognising in this child that which no-one else yet saw. One of my duties as a Canon of Chester Cathedral is to spend a day each month as a chaplain in the Cathedral. It is a job best described as 'loitering with intent'. Sometimes it can be a busy day with lots of conversations and people to meet. At other times it can be much quieter and there is time to idle. Idling is important. God often breaks into our lives when we are not rushing about being self-important.

Two reminders:

Firstly, our Lent series this year will be on Wednesday evenings, 7.30pm, in the Red Lion, Little Budworth. The theme will be hymns and their authors. I will offer a reflection on five hymns. The first one is the Wednesday after Ash Wednesday, i.e. 12th March. Everyone is welcome to join us.

Secondly, please remember that our Electoral Rolls need to be renewed this year. Every six years the old Roll is closed and everyone needs to apply to be on the new Roll. If you are on the current Roll and do not apply then you will not be on the new Electoral Roll. To be a member of the Electoral Roll you need to reside within the parish (and hopefully be active in the life of the church) or if you live outside of the parish then you need to have been

attending at least once a month for a period of no less than six consecutive months. Where someone is prevented from attending for good reason they can apply to join the Roll giving the reason why they are prevented from attending. Simply wanting a lie on a Sunday morning is not a good enough reason! My thanks to Jenny Marshall and Eileen Lees who are our Electoral Roll Officers. Copies of the application form are available in church. The deadline for submission is 12th April.



□ Church Clock

Keen eyed villagers and passers-by will have seen that our church clock has been at a standstill since early in December. Those of us in the parish who wind and maintain the clock were unable to find the reason for the problem. We therefore asked the experts to come and take a look.

The engineer from The Cumbria Clock Company visited on Friday 17th January and found nothing damaged or broken. He was able to restart the clock and it continues to run. However, the striking side of the clock does not work without manual intervention.

The engineer is puzzled by this as the mechanism for making the clock strike is robust steel work. The adjustment needed is very small, approximately 1mm and until we receive his report, we don't know how this is to be achieved,

nor the likely cost. I'm hoping the report will arrive by the end of January.
